As part of the Promise Stipend, applicant must acknowledge that Early Childhood Options will send a 1099-MISC at the end of the year if more than \$600 is paid to the individual, and it is the individual's responsibility to claim this as income on taxes. Prior to receiving payment, a W9 must be filled out and filed via Survey Monkey from the link provided.

 Lead Teacher and Assistant Teacher will administer the TS GOLD Assessment to all SPK children in their classrooms at all three checkpoints (Fall, Winter and Spring). Dates to be provided by Education Coordinator at Early Childhood Options.



Employer Awareness:

• The applicant's employer will be sent a notice that the teacher has enrolled in the program and that we will need the employer to give us data to confirm that the requirements have been met. Coaches will also be notified.

LIAISONS

Programs with over 50 children may identify up to three Liaisons: Two SEALs and one CCHL or Two CCHL and one SEAL

Child Health Liaison and SEAL Supplements will be awarded in September. The award time frame will run September to August, applications opening September 1 upon completion of set initiatives for each Liaison.

ALL LIAISONS MUST CONTACT Kim Theller FOR THE WORKSHEET. The goal worksheet requires initiatives, action steps, and evaluation pieces that are outlined.

To receive the Child Health Liaison or Social Emotional Action Leader Right Start Salary Supplement, liaisons must:

- CCHL must complete the Child Health Liaison Course and SEAL must complete all 18 Pyramid sessions.
- Submit a copy of the Certificate of Completion along with a completed application on Early Childhood Options online platform. http://eco1.smapply.org/
- Work a minimum of 20 hours in a licensed child care center program in Summit County.
- Attend at least two group meetings per year. One on one meetings will occur more often.
- Implement and evaluate ONE annual community initiative
- Implement and evaluate TWO annual program initiatives
- Liaisons will commit to working at least 2 hours per month outside of regularly scheduled work hours to fulfill community and program initiatives.
- Fulfill childcare licensing and best practices.
- Inform parents of Health Liaisons and/or Seal initiative (s)

~Local Funding: Right Start Quality Improvement Program

Right Start is our locally funded program open March through November providing funds based upon Colorado Shines rating Level and size of the program.

The Details:

- 50% of funds must be used for staff appreciation, retention and trainings.

- Purchases must align with the program's Colorado Shines Quality improvement plan, which should be updated annually.
- The application must be completed on Survey Monkey Apply by visiting our website at earlychildhoodoptions.org via the Quality Improvement Dollars Page.

~State Funding: Colorado Shines Quality Improvement

Colorado Shines Quality improvement is the state funding program that opens in July and closes in June. These funds are available to programs at a Colorado Shines Level 3 or higher. Home providers at a Level 3 or higher are also eligible for these funds.

The Details:

- You must apply through ecConnect.
- A program can submit receipts for reimbursement or purchase directly through the approved vendor to be billed to the Early Childhood Council.
- Funds may be used for building improvements and non-consumable materials for child care learning environment.
 - Professional development for staff.

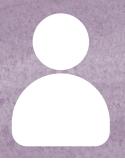
